



Post Desexing Care Sheet - Male Cat Desexing

Your cat has undergone an anaesthetic today for his desexing procedure. His anaesthetic and surgery went well. Both of his testicles were removed through an incision in his scrotum.

He may be a bit quiet and lethargic this evening but this is normal – he is still recovering from his anaesthetic. He has a small area of hair shaved on his leg – this was for his anaesthetic injection. He does not have any stitches – male cats heal very well and do not require stitches.

Care Instructions:

- Feed him **half of his normal dinner tonight**.
- Please keep him **quiet and inside the house for the next 48 hours**.
- Please keep the area clean and dry
- Please monitor the surgical incision for any signs of **redness, swelling or discharge**. *Please call us on 9743 1715 or bring him to the clinic if you notice any of these signs.*
- Please contact us if he is inappetant, has any diarrhea or vomiting or is very quiet.
